ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Govt. Degree College Haripurdhar came into existence in the year 2011 and since then has made a steady progress towards ensuring quality education to its students. Situated at the top of a hill, it provides a bird's eye view of the surrounding area. It is located in the serene and picturesque beauty of Churdhar range in the ambience of chaste mountains covered with evergreen cedar trees on one side and the thick woods of beautiful red rhododendron on the other. At the time of its inception, the college ran in 'Maa Bhangayani' Temple Complex and later started operations from the new campus w.e.f. June 2017. Eleven batches of undergraduate classes have graduated from this institute till date. The college presently has ample infrastructural facilities including three smart classrooms, a large and spacious library, examination hall, computer lab, a girls' common room and various office rooms with abundant quality furniture. In addition to these existing facilities, construction of a Multi-Purpose Hall has been undertaken by the funds received as RUSA grant for infrastructural development through HPPWD.

The Multi-Purpose Hall would encompass facilities like Canteen, Gymnasium, etc. in order to provide better amenities to students. To keep pace with the latest technology, facilities like free Wi-Fi, upgraded IT Laboratory with a dedicated server and CCTV cameras for security have been installed in the campus. Sufficient quantity of other material and equipment pertaining to sports and music along with other office and campus equipment like Water filter & storage tank, chairs, garden benches, solar lights, electronic siren, fire extinguishers, wooden flooring, wall paneling, creation of aluminum glass cabins for teachers & purchase of additional books for the library as per the institutional development plan of the college have been accomplished through the funds received as RUSA grant. The college campus has been bejeweled with state of art facilities at par with the colleges in nearby towns and cities, a clear manifestation of the aims of RUSA in providing quality education to "one and all" irrespective of the geographical or social limitations and disparities.

The college offers UG programmes in following subjects of Arts stream: English, Sociology, History, Political Science, Hindi, Physical Education, Music (Vocal), the subjects: Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics in the Science (Non-Medical) stream and Subjects of Commerce stream. The dedicated and highly motivated faculty of the college earnestly endeavors to make the process of learning an adventure, as well as a life enriching experience.

ADMISSION PROCESS

Admission will only take place through online mode. Students should visit the official website www.gcharipurdhar.edu.in and click on Admission and Fees and then Online Admission for 2025-26. Students can also directly click here: <https://gcharipurdhar.hightheducation.in/>

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

1. A student seeking admission to B. A. Ist Year should have passed 10+2 or an equivalent examination of a recognized board/university established by law in India with pass in five subjects including English.
2. The students of National Open School who have passed all the five subjects by securing requisite marks will be admitted. There is no provision for admission to the compartment cases of national open school. Students from vocational stream are also eligible for admission to these classes provided they fulfill the minimum eligibility conditions.
3. Twice failed candidates in the same class will not be admitted.
4. A student who fails in all the compulsory and elective subjects in the university annual examination will not be admitted to the same course /class in the college.
5. The students who have passed Prabhakar without passing +2 are not eligible for regular admission to any course in the college.

AGE LIMIT FOR ADMISSION TO UG COURSES

For admission to the 1st Year, a student must not be more than 23 Years (25 Years for girls) of age on 1st July 2025, e.g. the applicant should not be born earlier than 01/07/2002 in case of boys and 01/07/2000 in case of girls. However, in respect of SC and ST students, a relaxation of 3 years is given.

The Vice-Chancellor of H.P.U.-Shimla has the power to permit age relaxation up to a maximum of 6 months. All such cases could provisionally be granted age relaxation up to six months by the Principal and a consolidated list of such cases be sent for approval of the Vice- Chancellor. A candidate who has availed age relaxation at the time of first admission shall be eligible for the same in the subsequent classes also.

INSTRUCTIONS/ DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION TO B.A. 1st YEAR

- 1. Every Student must have their unique Email ID and this Email ID will be used for Admission.**
- 2. Only one Application form is to be filled with one Email ID (If a Students will fill his admission form from others email ID, It will be not be Accepted by the Admission Software).**
- 3. The Students have to be ready with following Documents:**
 - **Matriculation Certificate (1 photocopy)**
 - **12th Certificate (1 photocopy)**
 - **2 Passport size photograph of student.**
 - **Original School Leaving & Character Certificates issued by the school.**
 - **If 12th Class is passed as a private candidate, in that case character certificate may be obtained from a Gazetted Officer/ Panchayat Pradhan/ Municipal Councilor.**
 - **In case of opting for category benefit, SC/ST/OBC/IRDP/BPL/Minority. Community/ physically disabled the certificate must be enclosed from a competent authority.**
 - **Undertaking by the Applicant. (If required)**
 - **Himachal Bonafide Certificate must be attached by girl students to avail tuition fees concession.**
 - **Affidavit of Single Girl Child.**
 - **40% Disability Certificate (In case of Student with disability)**
 - **Copy of Aadhar Card.**
 - **Those who have passed their eligibility exam from a Board/ University other than Himachal Pradesh must submit original Migration Certificate.**
 - **Academic Bank of Credits ID (ABC ID) (1 photocopy)**

NOTE: A printed copy of the application form submitted online, copies of documents uploaded while filling online form, along with original certificates must be produced by the applicant at the time of Admission Counselling in the institution.

STEPS FOR ONLINE ADMISSION

Step 1: Visit the official website www.gcharipurdhar.edu.in and click on Admission and Fees and then on Online Admission for 2025-26. Students can also directly click here: <https://gcharipurdhar.hightheducation.in/>

Step 2: Register with your valid Email ID and create your account.

Note: Remember the Password and Phone number entered.

Step 3: After Registration, a verification message will be sent to your email ID which has to be verified from your email ID and then you can login with your email ID and Password.

Step 4: Fill the admission form and upload the required documents, photo and Signature.

Step 5: Submit the Prospectus fee of Rs. 50/- through online mode.

Note: Application Form will be processed only after submission of Prospectus fee of Rs. 50/-

Status of the application form has to be checked on regular basis by the applicant in order to find if there is any deficiency in the form. The Application will be verified by the Admission Committee members and after receiving the invoice on applicant's account, he/she has to pay the fee online.

NOTE:

- This is a three year course. The degree will be awarded when a candidate clears all courses within a maximum period of 05 years from the date of admission to this course.
- A candidate failing either or one or two subjects/papers will be given compartment in that subject/paper and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. Two chances (one at supplementary stage and one at the annual exam stage) will be given to clear the compartment.
- A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as failed in that year and will be required to repeat the entire year.

RAGGING: A PUNISHABLE OFFENCE

Ragging is a punishable offence. Ragging of all kind is strictly banned in the college campus. Anybody caught indulging in this evil exercise shall face penalty under the law. Act remotely suggestive of ragging should be reported to the college authorities/to the member of anti-ragging committee. A student who commits the offence of ragging shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term, which may extend to three years or shall also be liable to a fine, which may extend to Rs. 50,000 or both.

In order to have zero tolerance and its total elimination from the educational institutions Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4th May, 2001; 16th May, 2007 and 11th Feb. 2009 has directed as under:

“Ragging is banned in the institution. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiably harsh.” Punishment for ragging includes:

- Imprisonment, fine or both.
- Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology.
- Withholding scholarship or other benefits.
- Debarring from representation in events.
- Withholding of results.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) FOR UNDERGRADUATE CLASSES

The Himachal Pradesh University vide Letter No. 2-1/2012 H.P.U. (Academic) dated 4 June 2016 has notified the acceptance of the latest course curriculum under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) brought out by the University Grant Commission.

Outlines of Choice Based Credit System:

1. **Core Course:** 12 for general courses; 4 discipline specific papers each for regular courses and 2 papers each for English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com.

2. **Elective Course:** Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

2.1 **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE):** (2 each for regular courses): An elective course offered under the main discipline/ subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

2.2 **Generic Elective (GE) Course:** (2 each for B.A./ B.Com. regular courses) : An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/sof choice is called a Generic Elective.

3. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement: i. Environmental Science and ii. English/ Hindi/ MIL Communication/ Sanskrit. These are mandatory for all disciplines. 3.2 SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

3.1 **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/ Hindi Communication/ MIL Communication/ Sanskrit.

3.2 **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** (4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

CONTINUOUS AND COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA)

Accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course, it consists of following three Major components:

1. **Class Attendance:** Students are expected to be regular in attending the classes as this is very foundation of academic activities. In order to be eligible to appear in the University Examinations, a student must have 75% attendance in each of the course concerned, in theory as well as in practicals separately. The incentive for the classroom attendance will be awarded as CCA marks as follows:

(NOTE: 75% of attendance in a course is mandatory as per H.P. University regulations.)

2. **Mid-Term (Minor) Test:** There will be one mid-term test, to be conducted when approximately 2/3rd of the syllabus has been covered. This midterm test will be for 15 marks. Mid- term test will be conducted by the college in consultation with the teacher.
3. **Seminar/Assignment/Tutorials:** The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar/assignment/Tutorials etc. that the course teacher might give to the students.

ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDITS (ABC)

WHAT IS ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDITS (ABC)?

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is a virtual/digital storehouse that contains the information of the credits earned by individual students throughout their learning journey. It will enable students to open their accounts and give multiple options for entering and leaving colleges or universities. There will be “multiple exits” & “multiple entries” points during the higher education tenure & credits will be transferred through the ABC seamlessly.

ABC can be considered as an authentic reference to check the credit record of any student at any given point in time. Thus, the concept of ABC is fuel to boost the efficiency of faculty and help students embrace a multi-disciplinary educational approach. The idea is to make students “skillful professionals” and help their overall growth.

In a crux, the Academic Bank of Credits will be a game-changer in transforming Indian education to a great extent.

FUNCTIONS OF ABC

- The Academic Bank will be accountable for opening, closing, and validating the academic accounts of students.
- It will carry out tasks such as credit accumulation, credit verification, credit transfer/redemption of students.
- The courses include online and distance mode courses offered by the government and institutes.
- The validity of these academic credits earned by students will be up to seven years and students can redeem these credits.
- The credits can be redeemed and students can seek admission directly in the second year at any university.
- The validity will be up to seven years, hence, students will have to rejoin within seven years.

CREDIT INFORMATION AS PER ABC

As per the courses, a credit structure will be created by the Government. When a student pursues any course and clears exams, credits will be automatically awarded to them. Institutions need to fill out the details and upload the deposits in the students' Academic Credit Bank's account on the digital portal.

EVALUATION AND VERIFICATION OF CREDITS

Any kind of credit evaluation & verification will be carried out by the Academic Credit Bank at regular intervals. If students want to transfer the credits, they need to approach the ABC for further process. It will help in regulating the processes with ultimate authenticity.

TYPES OF COURSES

Online & offline – both types of courses are included in the scheme. Some of the important ones include National Schemes such as–

- NPTEL
- SWAYAM
- V-LAB

Thus, the ABC will cover almost all types of courses including distance learning courses to help students of every possible stream.

CREDITS VALIDITY

The credits earned by students will be valid for seven years. However, the validity of credits is subject to change depending on the type of courses or disciplines. In such instances, ABC will provide the details of the exceptions to students. Even if a student takes a break or is not able to continue their education, they may redeem the earned credits in the future within the time limit of seven years.

In accordance with NEP-2020, it is mandatory for all the students to generate their unique Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) ID before the next academic session. This can be done easily by following the steps given below:

1. Create account on Digilocker though Digilocker app or website.
2. Using your Aadhaar number and mobile no. linked with Aadhaar (In case the mobile number linked with Aadhaar is not active, then please update your mobile number by visiting Aadhaar update center viz. Post Office or authorized banks/CSC).
3. Then visit <https://www.abc.gov.in/>

Click on My Account > Student

4. Sign in using Digilocker account Id (linked mobile number) and password/pin
5. Select University>Himachal Pradesh University
6. Your ABC ID will be displayed on screen. Note it down and keep it safe.

REMEMBER: ABC ID is unique and can be generated only once.

IDENTITY CARD

Identity card is an important document as it shows the identity of a bonafide student. Soon after the admission in the college, Identity cum library card should be collected from the college library as per schedule prescribed by the Librarian. Each student must carry this card daily to the college. In case of loss of the identity card, duplicate identity card will be issued after producing the FIR in this context. For duplicate identity card, Rs. 30 /- will be charged. Students are not permitted to replace his/her photograph pasted on the identity card for any reason whatsoever. Students must carry their ID-Card along with them to college daily, anyone found without it will be fined.

LEAVE RULES

1. It is compulsory for all students get their leave sanctioned, before proceeding on leave. No student is supposed to be absent without getting his/her leave sanctioned by a course teacher or by the Principal.
2. Leave up to 03 days shall be sanctioned by the concerned subject teacher.
3. Leave more than 03 days shall be sanctioned by the Principal.
4. A student will be marked on-leave during the leave period and the same will not be considered for calculating the lecture attendance for determining eligibility to appear in the University exam.
5. Students who are officially deputed to participate in sports and extra-curricular activities of the H.P. University Youth Festival/Championships are treated on leave for the purpose of attendance, provided that prior permission has been sort from the Principal in this matter and its note has been made by the subject teacher in the attendance register.
6. Maximum leave during the academic session will not exceed more than 10 days. It is personal responsibility of each student to get his/her name entered in the attendance register of each concerned subject teacher. If he/she fails to do so, he/she will be treated absent.

NAME STRUCK OFF AND RE-ADMISSION

1. If a student willingly remains absent continuously for 06 days without sanction of leave/ without information, and his/her 10 days absentee in a month, his/her name will be struck off from the College Rolls. He/she will have to seek re-admission on the recommendation of the concerned subject teacher.
2. Re-admission will be allowed within the next 06 days by paying the re-admission fee and absence fine as per rules, subject to the prior approval by the Principal.
3. Re-admission fee for the first time is Rs.100 and for the second time Rs.200.
4. There will be no re-admission for the third time.

MIGRATION

Migration from other colleges to this college and vice-versa is governed by H. P. University Rules. A migration certificate can be issued only if the student is registered with the H.P. University.

LIBRARY

Library is the storehouse of knowledge, when explored viciously by the hungry minds to satiate their never ending quest for knowledge. The college library in the new campus has sufficient space and abundant quality furniture for the seekers of knowledge. The library presently has about 2000 books on various subjects and disciplines. There is a plan to use RUSA funds for purchase of additional reference books for the library so that it will have an abundance of books, magazines and newspapers in the coming future.

LIBRARY RULES:-

Students are expected to make the maximum use of library facility during their free periods and follow the rules mentioned below:

- (i) Only two books shall be issued at a time for a period of 14 days. If the issued book(s) is not returned or re- issued in time a fine will be charged per book, per day.
- (ii) Reference books will not be issued.
- (iii) In case of a loss or damage of an issued book, it will either be replaced or its payment at the present cost will be accepted only with the permission of the Principal.

COMPUTER LAB

To keep pace with the fast changing field of Information & Communication Technology, an IT Lab has been set up at the college to benefit the college students. It is well-equipped with computers, an Over Head Projector and PA system. The computer lab has recently been upgraded through the utilization of RUSA funds for purchase of a Server with Tally ERP-9 software and 15 additional computers along with necessary furniture, networking and installation of 5 KVA UPS. A free Wi-Fi facilities has also been installed in the college campus and is functional since December 2017.

SPORTS & CO CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

“A Healthy Mind Resides in a Healthy Body”. Co-curricular activities are the components of non-academic curriculum that helps in developing various aspects of the personality of the students. They supplement and compliment the main curriculum to bring about an all-round development of the students. They are the practical experiences of students. Theoretical knowledge gets strengthened when a relevant co-curricular activity is organized. The college organizes various events such as: sports/games, Debate, Declamation, Discussion, folk songs, folk dance, fancy dress competition, Quiz Contests etc. from time to time. The Sports Committee conducts frequent trials to select teams for participation in inter-college sports competitions as and when organized by the University. Students are encouraged to participate in these activities to help them develop frankness, clarity and fluency of language, coordination, adjustment and better self-expression.

COLLEGE STUDENTS' CENTRAL ASSOCIATION (CSCA)

Students of today are the leaders of tomorrow". To encourage students participation in maintaining proper academic atmosphere and in organizing cultural activities etc., and to promote opportunities for the development of character, leadership and discipline and the spirit of service among students, the Students' Central Association is constituted every year. Elections are conducted for the posts of four office bearers and class representatives as per the rules/schedule announced by H.P. University every year. Other members of CSCA are nominated by the Principal in accordance with the CSCA constitution.

PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

PTA has been established under section 2.33 to 2.33.7 of the HP Education Code, 2001, in the college to facilitate community-college participation. It helps in better coordination and interaction between parents and teachers for improvement of academic standards and infrastructural facilities. It provides an interface for exchanging ideas, promote mutual understanding and increase the effectiveness of the educational programs by improving the environment. Parents, guardians (blood relation of the students), teachers and head of the institution are members of this association. Parents are advised to attend the meeting of the General House scheduled for July so that they may make meaningful contribution to the development of the college.

OLD STUDENT'S ASSOCIATION (OSA)

An organisation of graduates or, in a broader sense, former students is known as an old students organisation. The institution has a functional OSA registered under the HP Societies Registration Act 2006. This association provides a range of services and advantages to support alumni in keeping in touch with their alma mater and other graduates. Supporting a network of former students who will help to increase awareness of the institution is one of OSA's primary goals. Old student associations seek to unite people who have similar interests, much like the majority of other college student organisations. The community of former students discusses their experiences in the outside world that they encounter once they leave the school. The OSA network links former students with numerous professional connections as well as other college alumni.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

To develop an in- house quality system for conscious, consistent and targeted action to improve the academic and administrative performance, Internal Quality Assurance Cell has been formed in the college. The IQAC of this college constantly strives to usher in quality by removing deficiencies and enhancing quality to help provide the best learning environment to the students. The main aim of the IQAC is to identify, develop and propagate the best practices and to systematize the efforts towards academic excellence.

CAREER COUNSELLING AND PLACEMENT CELL

To assist the students in making informed educational or occupational choices, a Career Guidance and Guidance Cell has been set up in the college. The cell aims to develop competencies in self-knowledge, skills and experience necessary to identify options, explore alternatives and succeed in society. We help the students in self-appraisal, decision making, goal setting and career planning depending upon their socio-economic and educational background. The cells also guide the students by providing valuable information regarding the job scenario and help them develop an itinerary to achieve their aim in life.

SEMINARS & GROUP DISCUSSIONS

Seminars and Group Discussions are organized to develop the information processing abilities of the students leading to development of higher cognitive abilities. While discussion is the simplest form of learning technique it helps in reinforcing the knowledge and breaking the monotony of the class. On the other hand, seminars help in acquiring in-depth knowledge of certain topics and develop the research aptitude of the students. Efforts will be made to engage maximum number of students in these activities to make them confident and true seekers of knowledge.

THE STUDENT CHARTER

Eminent persons are invited to honour the students and this gives them an added reason to excel in their respective fields. MENTOR- MENTEE PROGRAMME

The institution provides support to students to excel in academic, sports, cultural and extracurricular activities through its mentor –mentee groups. The academically weak students are assisted with remedial classes and career counseling and guidance is provided to the outgoing students. The students are also motivated to participate in various academic, sports and cultural activities at college, university, national and international levels.

GENERAL REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

Govt. Degree College, Haripurdhar, prides itself on the healthy, congenial and empowering relationship it fosters between all the members of the College Community. 6. The following activities shall be considered as violative of the college discipline and may result in fine, expulsion or rustication, depending on the gravity of the offence:

- Quarrelling in the campus, indulging in violence, use of force and ragging.
- Shouting, making noise and disturbing classes.
- Breaking/ damaging college property or writing on/defacing walls and blackboards. They shall compensate the college for the damage caused and shall also have to pay the punitive fine as well.
- Bringing outsiders to the campus.
- Putting up a notice, sticking bills etc. on the notice board or at any other place without the permission of the Principal.
- Crowding in corridors and staircases and blocking passages or Eve-teasing.
- Any student using Alcohol, Tobacco, Gutkha and other narcotics in the college campus will be fined up to Rs. 500 /- and is liable for expulsion or resuscitation from the college.
- Only those functions will be allowed to be held in the college which are organized by college or have been permitted by the college authorities with prior permission from the concerned authorities. Failing which, would be treated as a case of breach of discipline.
- No tours/parties will be organized without proper authorization from the principal.
- Unnecessary use of mobile phones or playing music on mobile phones in the campus.

7. A student who is found guilty of misconduct shall not be eligible for any scholarship, prize, fee concession or membership of the CSCA or any other important bodies in the college.

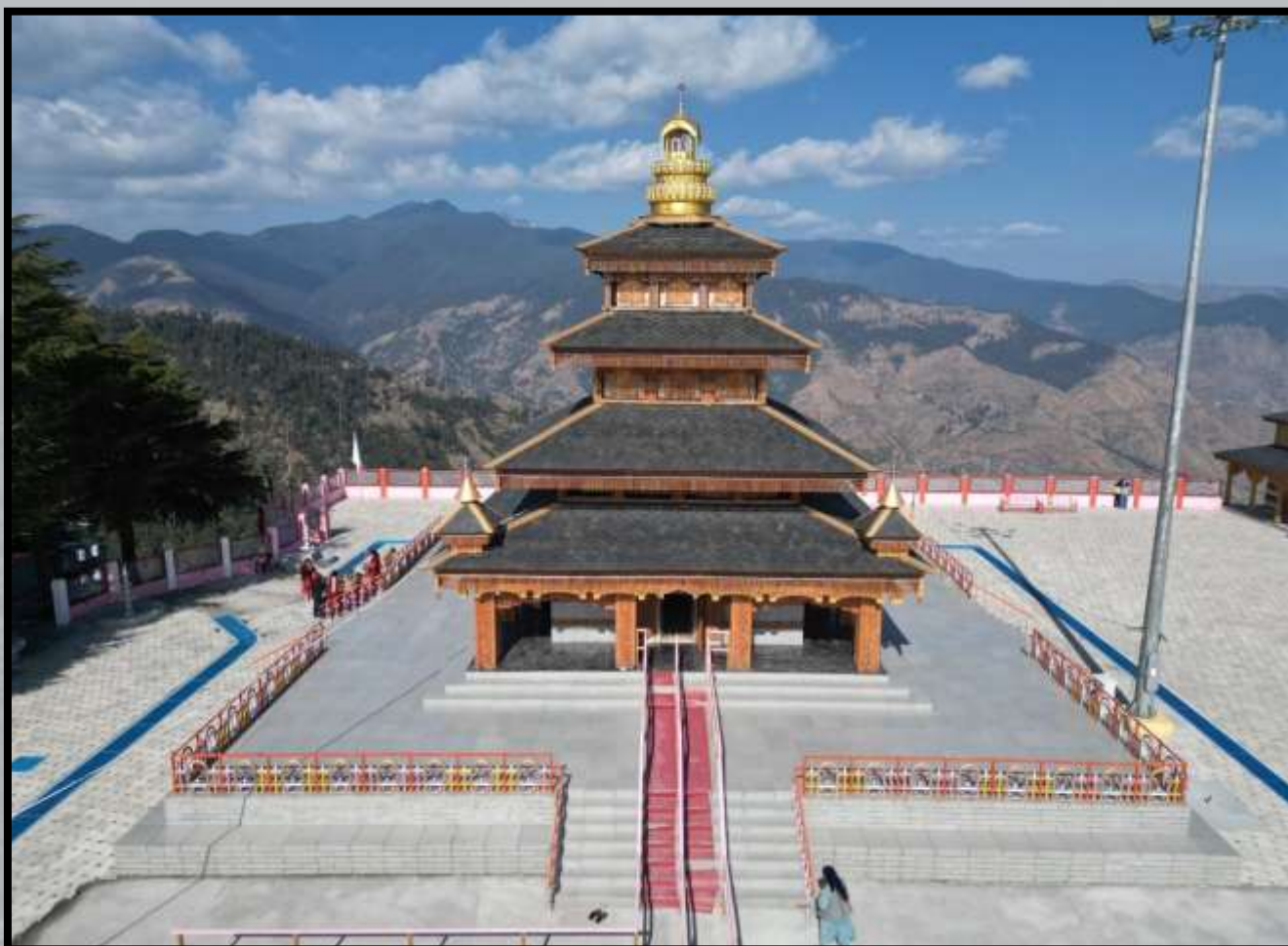
